

SECTION 2 - General Terms of Competitions

All competitions shall be played in accordance with the Rules of Golf as approved by the R&A Rules and Local Rules approved by The Ashley Wood Golf Club committees

Qualifications

All playing members must have an active WHS handicap. All players competing for a cup or trophy as designated on the Perpetual Trophies list (See Appendix A), whether as Strokeplay or knockout competition must have 12 qualifying cards on WHS within the last 12 months (rolling) of which 6 must be competitions. All cards, acceptable for handicap, count wherever they have been played. This can be checked on the England Golf App or by the Handicap Secretary or Pro Shop.

Minimum Entries

For Sunday only Competitions 2 players
For Tuesday only Competitions 5 players
For combined Competitions 5 players

Playing handicap allowances.

Allowances will be in line with the R&A mandatory allowances. The Mandatory Allowances Table can be found on the Competition Notice Board in the Ladies changing room.

Buggies

Buggies may only be used by a player who is on the Club's Infirm list (Perpetuals only).

Inclement Weather

Following Club Rules a Competition is never cancelled unless the course is closed. If competitors miss their tee times they should re-book in the Pro Shop.

Should the number of holes being played be reduced due to weather, the following is applicable:

Course reduced to 13 holes – Competition to continue as planned.

Course reduced to 9 holes (typically Holes 1-7 and 17-18 (non-rated course) then the competition will be cancelled and it will be general play.

Day and Tee Times

Ladies' competitions are run on a Tuesday with an alternate day on a Sunday. Ladies are eligible to play on either day but the protected Sunday Tee Times are to be used in the first instance by the designated Sunday ladies.

Following agreement by the Ladies Committee Ladies can play at any time on either day. Tee times are booked using the BRS booking system. Booking within designated tee times can be made 2 weeks ahead, other bookings can be made one week before.

Note: If you are unable to play then it is your responsibility to remove your name from BRS. Failure to show up 3 times in a 6 month period will result in a 2 month ban from using BRS. Ladies who have selected to play on BRS are expected to be ready on the approach to the first tee at least 10 minutes prior to the teeing off time.

On the Day

Registering intention to compete.

On the day of competition, a player must register her entry by paying the competition fee in the Pro Shop who will record the player's name in the competition entry list for that day. It is also necessary for the player to sign in on the computer after which a label showing the players Handicap Index, Course Handicap and Playing handicap, will be printed to be put on the card.

Marking a Card – Strokeplay

The marker marks the gross strokes taken on the player's card. If it is a Stableford format then the points scored should be entered as well.

At the end of the round the player should:

- Check and agree the score for each hole and the total score/points taken and record the total no of shots/points in the box at the bottom of the card.
- Check that the marker has signed the card and countersign the card.
- Enter the score into the computer and place the card in the Ladies Competition Box

Unless there are extenuating circumstances failure to ensure the above will result in disqualification. No alterations may be made to the card once entered on the computer or placed in the box.
