

Section 6 - Ladies' Cup and Trophy Competitions

All players competing for a cup or trophy must meet the qualification requirements as stated in Section 1 of the Competition Rules document.

All cups and trophies shall be played in accordance with the rules of England Golf – 95% course handicap qualifying competitions, unless otherwise stated.

Adams Trophy

This trophy was presented by Mrs Elizabeth Adams, a past member of the club. The format is Strokeplay/Medal.

Ann Watson Trophy

This trophy was presented by Mrs Ann Watson a past member of the club. The format is 9 hole Stableford, 2 clubs and a putter (used only on the putting green). Non qualifier.

Dianne Underwood Trophy

The trophy was presented by Mrs Dianne Underwood a past Lady Captain. The trophy is for SUNDAY ladies only and is Strokeplay/Medal format. The winner is the player (silver or bronze) who returns the lowest aggregate nett score for 3 of the 5 designated rounds. If two or more competitors tie, the winner shall be decided on the nett score of the last 9,6,3 or 1 holes of all 3 rounds added together. If still a tie, a decision shall be made by a play off over 18 holes Strokeplay on current playing handicap.

Everett Vase

This trophy was presented by Mrs Kay Everett a past Lady Captain and President of the club.

It is a 9 hole stableford competition played for each Tuesday between 1st April and 30th September. The winner will be the lady with the best 6, 9 hole rounds over the period of the competition.

Granny Trophy

This trophy was presented by Mrs Betty Crisfield a past Lady Captain and Mrs Joan Robson a past President and Lady Captain. This trophy is for grandmothers only and the format is Stableford.

Non Granny Trophy

This trophy was presented by Mrs Margaret Pike a past member. The trophy is for non-grandmothers and the format is Stableford.

Golf Foundation Brooch

The Golf Foundation Brooch is awarded to the winner of the yearly Stableford competition in support of the Golf Foundation. (Need to enter yearly.)

Hyde Cup

This trophy was presented by Mr Bob Hyde a past President and Captain of the club. The format is Stableford.

Charity Spoon

The charity spoon will reflect the charity supported by the current Lady Captain. It can be played on any day up to October 31st. The format is Stableford.

President's Cup

This cup was presented by Mrs Jackie Carey a past President of the club and the format is Strokeplay/Medal.

Rabbit Plate

This plate is for ladies with a handicap index 28.5 or over (this is the high bronze category as defined by the Dorset County Ladies association). The format is Stableford.

Rose Bowl

This cup was presented by Mrs Sammy Ross a past member of the club. The format is Strokeplay/Medal.

Sarah Sanderson Centenary Lady

This cup was presented by Mrs Sarah Sanderson a past member of the club and was presented at the centenary tea in 1996. The format is Strokeplay/Medal.

The MillenniumPlate

The plate was presented by Mrs Sue Rogers the Lady Captain in 2020 and the format is Stableford.

Winner's Cup

This cup was presented by Mrs Helen Broadhead-Williams a past member. The competition is for players who have won a club trophy or medal in the previous year. The format is Strokeplay.

Non Winner's Cup

This cup was presented by Mrs Sheila McMahon a past Lady Captain. The competition is for players who have not won a Club Trophy or medal in the previous year. The format is Strokeplay/Medal.

Stableford Trophy

This trophy was presented by Mrs Mary Buchan a past Lady Captain. The best four Stableford cards are counted from 6 designated Stableford competitions.

Sunday Ladies Trophy

This trophy was presented by Mrs Jane Elliott a past Lady Captain. The competition is only for Sunday ladies and is Strokeplay/Medal.

Summer Knockouts

Celebration Cup

This is a knockout competition for those Ladies with a Playing Handicap of 30 or lower at the time of the draw. The format is Matchplay and stroke allowance is full difference in handicap. Matches can commence on 1st April or when Gold tees are opened.

King's Cup

The King's Cup was presented by Mrs D King a past Lady Captain and is a knockout competition for those with a Playing Handicap of 31 and above at the time of the draw. The format is matchplay and stroke allowance is full difference in handicap. Matches begin on 1st April or when Gold tees are opened.

Competitions ongoing through the year.

Golfer of the Year

This trophy was presented by Mrs Nelda Oakes a past Lady Captain. The competition is the aggregate of points gained from medal and trophy competitions throughout the year nominated by Nelda. Points are awarded for 1st place to 10th place. The competition will be completed by mid November. In the case of Winner/Non Winner and Granny/Non-Granny the points will be awarded for 1st to 5th in each competition, 5 points to 1 point.

In perpetual competitions such as the Kings Cup and Celebration Cup points will be awarded from the quarter final stage -2 points, semi-final -4 points, runner up 6 points and winner 8 points.

Birdie Tree

If a birdie has been achieved in any qualifying competition, players enter their names on the appropriate hole on the Birdie Tree

Par Tree

The Par Tree is for handicap indexes 28.5-54 at the start of the year. If a par has been achieved in any qualifying competition the player should enter their name on the appropriate hole on the Par Tree.

Eclectic Competition

Duration of the competition is 1st July to 31st October.

Entry for 12 cards must be paid at the time of signing the entry sheet. These cards can be used at any time other than in Matchplay. The first card must be a complete 18 hole card. Subsequently, any 9 or 18 hole round qualifies, but in the spirit of golf, no hole is to be played more than once in a round. Half of handicap at the close of play on 31st October is to be deducted from the final score.

Ringer Competition

Duration of the competition is April 1st – June 30th

After signing the entry sheet and paying the entry fee, you will receive a special 'RINGER' scorecard.

The object of the competition is to record a score you have obtained for each hole that you consider you cannot better in any subsequent rounds. Enter this score against the appropriate hole on the Ringer scorecard and have it initialed and dated by your playing partner. Once a score has been recorded for a hole it **cannot** be altered even if you achieve a better score in a later round. All entries must be recorded in ink. **Match play will not count for this competition.** Scores are allowed from any 9 or 18 hole round, but no hole is to be played more than once in a round. When the card is complete, the result is worked out by deducting half the playing handicap held on the date of your last entry. It is the player's responsibility to enter this on the scorecard.
